David A. Aguilar is an internationally recognized astronomer and author of non-fiction books designed for space learners of all ages. His expertise lies in showing us the fascinating connections between the universe, nature, and ourselves. He shares a spirited ability to open minds to his exciting new views of space and all its wondrous worlds of discovery. From television appearances to publicizing the Hubble Space Telescope and NASA's New Horizons Missions, to authoring and illustrating award-winning space science books, he has shown a lifelong commitment to being on the leading edge of our knowledge about the universe. Accordingly, in 2010 Asteroid 1990DA was designated by the International Astronomical Union to honor his exceptional science education outreach efforts.

David is former Director of Science Information at the Harvard-Smithsonian Center for Astrophysics in Cambridge, MA. He left Harvard in 2015 to join NASA's New Horizons Mission special media team on the historic **Pluto Flyby Mission**, and rejoined the New Horizons team in 2018-19 for the **Ultima Thule Flyby**, historically traveling to the furthest edge our solar system.


He is the Author and Space Artist of eight **National Geographic** and three **Random House** award-winning books including: "7 Wonders of the Milky Way", a lively galactic journey through our home in the cosmos, followed by "LUNA: The Science and Stories of Our Moon" in time for the 50th anniversary of man's walk on the moon. He is an onscreen contributor and space artist for the **History Channel** "UNIVERSE" series, the **Science Channel** "NASA's Unexplained Files", and **NHK** (Japanese National Television Corporation) COSMIC FRONT series, and a featured contributor in "Chesley Bonestell: A Brush With The Future" - an award-winning documentary about this renowned architect, space artist, and visionary.
